# DURING THE FIRST 5 YEARS OF PROFESSIONAL LIFE

#### Challenge

Negative perceptions of the teaching profession

Solution

Share what you love about being a music educator with your students and offer opportunities for students at all levels to demonstrate leadership and teaching skills and to learn about the music education profession.

Persistent inequities in how students are recruited, auditioned, and enrolled

Implement teacher cadet programs and curricula designed to encourage underrepresented groups to explore the music teaching profession. Low teacher pay and professional expenses (student loan debt, certification, etc.)

Engage in purposeful and meaningful advocacy efforts on behalf of the profession.

#### Challenge

Participation, transportation, and private instruction expenses

Solution

Work with students to mitigate financial and transportation challenges so they can participate and also meet familial obligations, such as work. Lack of alignment between university program content and professional expectations in PK-12 instruction

Participate in discussions with higher education about community and student needs as they work to revise curriculum and other program requirements.

#### Social and geographic isolation

Participate in affinity groups and other online communities specific to your area of expertise or cultural background.

#### Challenge

Limited curricular offerings beyond band, orchestra, and choir

Solution

To engage different segments of the student population, create new courses such as songwriting, music technology, production, audio engineering, composition, etc.



Lack of funding and time for meaningful professional development and mentoring.

Advocate for and participate in sustainable mentoring programs and content-specific professional development offered by school districts and state MEAs.
